<p><u>Draw and Make</u></p> <p>Design a costume for a character in your favourite fairy tale. Label the costume's materials and write a sentence explaining why you have used these materials.</p>	<p><u>Draw and Make</u></p> <p>Make a throne for either a King or Queen from materials/objects that you would normally recycle. Think about how you might join or connect different materials together. How have you achieved this?</p>
<p><u>Research</u></p> <p>Research Kings and Queens: are there any that are dead or alive who inspire and excite you? You can write or draw why they interest you. What interesting facts have you learnt?</p>	<p><u>Research</u></p> <p>Make a list of carnivores, omnivores or herbivores that can be found in Richmond Park. You could use a Venn diagram to sort your findings.</p>
<p><u>Write</u></p> <p>Create a fairy tale character. What does your character look like? Describe them using adjectives. Can you use the '-er' and '-est' suffixes?</p>	<p><u>Write</u></p> <p>Create and describe a setting for an imaginary fairy tale character. Use adjectives to describe the weather; the landscape and any objects in your imaginary scene.</p>
<p><u>Maths</u></p> <p>Look around your home to collect different items and measure them using hands, feet, rulers or anything you like. Which is the longest? Which is the shortest? Can you order them?</p>	<p><u>Maths</u></p> <p>How many ways are there to make the number 10? How many different ways can you find to represent number bonds to 10? (e.g. using household items) Challenge: can you show number bonds to 20?</p>
